Rector's Rambling

Kudos to everyone who made it to Church this morning with the road closings in effect for

the Detroit Free Press Marathon.

When I first arrived at St. John's in 2001 the Marathon was a smaller affair, with the starting line at the Tiger statue in front of Comerica Park, and ending in Ford Field. Eventually as the number of participants grew the start moved out to Woodward in front of the Fox Theatre, and then the start/finish moved down to the Free Press building on Fort Street. Each year there seemed to be a tweak or two to the route but for many of the years road closures were mostly to the south of the church.

The last few years, however, the marathon has surrounded St. John's, running up Woodward and through Brush Park. Thankfully since a portion of it goes along the Dequindre Cut under Gratiot Ave, using the freeway and exiting off the I-375 Madison Exit (on the left side) allows for getting to the Church for Sunday worship by coming up St. Antoine, Witherell and Montcalm Street from the east of the Church.

Good luck to all the runners, and here is hoping some of them will join us the other 51 Sundays a year

Today in your Order of Service is a pledge card for the coming year. THANK YOU for your generous support of the parish this year and in years past,

and I hope that you will continue to be generous in support of St. John's in the coming year, God willing. Your support of the church isn't just a financial decision, but it is also a spiritual discipline, making an offering for the support of the ministry of the church. Tithing, which is the first 10% of ones income, is the biblical expectation in the Old Testament, and our Lord tells us that our righteousness should exceed that of the scribes and pharisees, who we are told tithed.

Giving in support of the Church is a tangible sign of thankfulness for the blessings that God has given us, as well as a discipline to help us not be so attached to money. Giving that portion is a sure way to acknowledge that all things come of the Lord and that we are grateful that He has provided to us the means and ability to earn it.

St. John's has 4 streams of income. Giving by parishioners is the most important of all. We also have a lease agreement for the property next to the church which is now used for parking and later will be developed into a building. An endowment left as a bequest in 2004 funds the Edwards Organ Scholarship for our assistant organist. And there is a small portion of many that comes from renting meeting and event space, and occasionally the bequests from the estates of late parishioners.

Please pray about how God may be leading you to support the parish now and in the coming year, and move forward on that in Faith.

Communion Procedure

The Episcopal House of Bishops, in a 1979 teaching, lays out the following guideline for non-Episcopalians to receive communion in an Episcopal Church: The persons should 1) have been Baptized with water in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, 2) believe Christ is present in the sacrament, 3) have been admitted to Holy Communion in their own denomination, and 4) are attempting, by God's grace, to live in love and charity with their neighbor. If you have any questions, please speak to the priest.

To receive the Host, raise your crossed hands, right palm over left. You may also receive directly on the tongue. If you do not wish to receive the Cup, cross your arms over your chest and wait for the chalice bearer to

pass by.

If you are not receiving communion, you still may come forward to the rail, cross your arms over your chest,

and receive a blessing.

If you are physically unable to approach the rail, please inform an usher and the Sacrament will be brought to you.

Pastoral Care

Please inform the clergy if you or a family member are ill, hospitalized, or unable to attend the regular worship of the Church so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. Please contact the clergy to discuss arrangements for baptisms, weddings, or burials **before** any announcement or other plans are made.

St. John's Teaching Notes

Tithing

When discussing stewardship the word "tithe" comes up frequently. What is a tithe, and how does it apply to your spiritual life?

The tithe is an offering to God of the **first** 10% of your income. In the Old Testament, God requires this, saying the first 10% of your fields, flocks or vineyards are to be given as an offering to the Lord. (Leviticus 27:30) It is a sign and symbol of gratitude that the Lord has provided for you. One of the offertory sentences for the Holy Communion service sums this up saying, "All things come of thee, O Lord, and of thine own have we given thee" (1 Chronicles 29:14). With the offering we show gratitude because it is 100% God's and He has blessed us with the provision of it. It is also a sign that we trust that God will continue to provide for us in the future as well. (Malachi 3:10)

In the New Testament, Jesus mentions the tithe in reference to those who are doing it for appearances or self-righteousness, not with a joyful heart. Rather than saying the Pharisees are wrong for tithing, he says our righteousness must *exceed* that of the scribes and Pharisees. (Matthew 5:20) We should be giving and doing so with a right heart.

But throughout the New Testament there is reference to the support of the ministry and need to not be so attached to one's possessions that they become a distraction or even an idol. Giving with a cheerful heart is a great antidote to such a malady.

In the Book of Common Prayer we read in the Offices of Instruction, My bounden duty is to follow Christ, to worship God every Sunday in his Church; and to work and pray and give for the spread of his kingdom. (p. 291) The support of your parish church, working toward a tithe of 10%, is an important aspect that duty. And to do so with a cheerful heart is a spiritual treasure.

If you are not tithing now, pray the Lord to help you to move toward that level of giving to His Greater Honor and Glory, and your sanctification.

Bless the founders and benefactors of this parish, and recompense them with the riches of Thine everlasting kingdom, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.
