Rector's Rambling

One very important aspect of membership in the Church is what is known as Discipleship.

The word disciple literally means one who follows. We are disciples of Jesus Christ. Although the word apostle is sometimes used as a synonym, apostle means one who is sent. In the Bible the 12 apostles are also considered disciples of Jesus, but not all disciples are sent out as leaders. We are all called to be followers of Jesus Christ.

When we talk about discipleship in the Church we refer to our continued learning of The Faith, being equipped and built up for mission and ministry. Baptism and Confirmation are beginning points, not an end point, in our learning. We must continue to learn in order to be able to live the faith, and to share it.

How do we do this? Primarily we do it through worship. The late Bishop Emrich said "In prayer and worship, which are the means of Grace by which God's life comes to us, we become what we could not otherwise become." We are also transformed from the inside out by the Grace of the Blessed Sacrament and instructed by hearing Scripture read in worship, as well as expounded upon in the sermon.

But we have to take the opportunity to further our discipleship by learning the Scriptures through individual study as well as corporate study. A bible through the year course, such as those offered through podcasts, are a great start! The Daughters of the King have a regular bible study and in the new calendar year we will restart our Sunday Bible Study.

Also, starting December 7 will be offering a class *An Outline of an Anglican Life*, on Sundays after the 10 AM Service (and a bit of coffee hour). This 8 week course is an expansion of the Catechism and the Offices of Instruction found in the 1928 Book of Common Prayer. Class dates are December 7 and 14, then January 4 through February 8. If you are going to be away for some of the dates we can make a video of that lecture available to those absent that day. PLEASE SIGN UP so we have enough books prepared for the class!

Communion Procedure

The Episcopal House of Bishops, in a 1979 teaching, lays out the following guideline for non-Episcopalians to receive communion in an Episcopal Church: The persons should 1) have been Baptized with water in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, 2) believe Christ is present in the sacrament, 3) have been admitted to Holy Communion in their own denomination, and 4) are attempting, by God's grace, to live in love and charity with their neighbor. If you have any questions, please speak to the priest.

To receive the Host, raise your crossed hands, right palm over left. You may also receive directly on the tongue. If you do not wish to receive the Cup, cross your arms over your chest and wait for the chalice bearer to

pass by.

If you are not receiving communion, you still may come forward to the rail, cross your arms over your chest,

and receive a blessing.

If you are physically unable to approach the rail, please inform an usher and the Sacrament will be brought to you.

Pastoral Care

Please inform the clergy if you or a family member are ill, hospitalized, or unable to attend the regular worship of the Church so that a pastoral visit can be Please contact the clergy to discuss arrangements for baptisms, weddings, or burials before any announcement or other plans are made.

Outreach

Food may be deposited in the basket at the entrance of the church to aid the neighborhood ministry to the poor through Crossroads and Georgia Street Commu-

St. John's Teaching Series **Ordination Promises**

1928 Book of Common Prayer

November 26th is Fr. Kelly's thirty-first anniversary of his ordination. These are some of the promises made on that day.

Bishop. Are you persuaded that the Holy Scriptures contain all Doctrine required as necessary for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ? And are you determined, out of the said Scriptures to instruct the people committed to your charge; and to teach nothing, as necessary to eternal salvation, but that which you shall be persuaded may be concluded and proved by the Scripture?

Answer. I am so persuaded, and have so determined, by God's grace.

Bishop. Will you then give your faithful diligence always so to minister the Doctrine and Sacraments, and the Discipline of Christ, as the Lord hath commanded, and as this Church hath received the same, according to the Commandments of God; so that you may teach the people committed to your Cure and Charge with all diligence to keep and observe the same?

Answer. I will so do, by the help of the Lord.

Bishop. Will you be ready, with all faithful diligence, to banish and drive away from the Church all erroneous and strange doctrines contrary to God's Word; and to use both public and private monitions and exhortations, as well to the sick as to the whole, within your Cures, as need shall require, and occasion shall be given?

Answer. I will, the Lord being my helper.

Bishop. Will you be diligent in Prayers, and in reading the Holy Scriptures, and in such studies as help to the knowledge of the same, laying aside the study of the world and the flesh?

Answer. I will endeavour so to do, the Lord being my helper.

Bishop. Will you be diligent to frame and fashion your own selves, and your families, according to the Doctrine of Christ; and to make both yourselves and them, as much as in you lieth, wholesome examples and patterns to the flock of Christ?

Answer. I will apply myself thereto, the Lord being my helper.

Bishop. Will you maintain and set forwards, as much as lieth in you, quietness, peace, and love, among all Christian people, and especially among them that are or shall be committed to your charge?

Answer. I will so do, the Lord being my helper.

Bishop. Will you reverently obey your Bishop, and other chief Ministers, who, according to the Canons of the Church, may have the charge and government over you; following with a glad mind and will their godly admonitions, and submitting yourselves to their godly iudgments?

Answer. I will so do, the Lord being my helper.
