The Chapel is famous for its Great Occasions and these events reflect not only the importance of the statutory choral Services but also some of the Royal and State Occasions which take place in the Queen's Free Chapel of St. George. Among these is the annual Service for the Order of the Garter, when the Knights of the Order, together with Her Majesty The Queen, process through the Castle to the Chapel for their Festival Service.

Sing we merrily unto God our strength was written for organist Peter Hurford and the St. Albans Diocesan Choirs' Festival 1962. Sidney Campbell and Peter Hurford were two of the three examiners for Dr. Lewis' FRCO certification.
